



Czech Film Fund

The Czech Film Fund is the main funding body in film in the Czech Republic. It supports all stages of film production, as well as promotion, distribution and other film-related areas. The Fund also administers production incentives for audio-visual projects made in the Czech Republic. The Czech Film Center as a division of the Fund promotes and markets Czech films and the local film industry worldwide. It collaborates with major international film festivals and co-production platforms and utilizes a global network of partners. The Czech Film Commission as a division of the Fund promotes the country with its film infrastructure as one of the world's top destinations for audiovisual production.

The Slovak Audiovisual Fund, operating since 2010, is the main public funding institution for the Slovak audiovisual culture and industry. The aim of the Fund is to support the entire film value chain - development, production, distribution, and promotion of audiovisual works, cinemas, festivals, research, training activities, innovations of technologies. Recipient of financing from the Fund shall be individual or legal entity registered in the Slovak Republic.

TV series funding: Yes, Slovak Audiovisual Fund Major production calls: A special program of the AVF is dedicated to animated films of all lengths where a Slovak production company is the main or majority producer. A Slovak producer is considered a majority or co-majority producer if the Slovak artistic and financial share exceeds 40% of the total budget for a two-sided co-production or 30% for a three-sided co-production. The development grant is defined as a lump sum based on the type of project. The maximum grant for a project is € 2 million for production. There are two calls per year for production (usually in February and September) and two calls per year for development (usually in March and October). For projects of animated series intended for broadcasting on TV and produced by a Slovak production company as the main producer (as above, the share of the Slovak producer must be above 40%/30%), there is a special program of AVF dedicated exclusively to TV production, with two calls per year (usually in February and September).

Minority co-production calls: Minority co-producers can enter the co-production in all the phases of film production, except for development phase (i.e. in the production/post-production phase). The co-production project has to fulfill the Council of Europe Convention on Cinematographic Co-production criteria. Minority co-production projects shall be supported only once. The maximum grant allotted for minority co-productions is 200,000 EUR per one project. 80% of it has to be spent in Slovakia. There are two calls per year – usually in February and in September.

Special call for minority animation coproduction: The call for minority animation co-production is included in the majority animation production call.

General call for minority coproduction (animation included): The maximum grant allotted for minority co-productions is 200,000 EUR per one project.
